THE YEAR 2018 IN REVIEW

REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT & REGISTRAR

he College of Chiropodists of Ontario has an important role in regulating chiropodists and podiatrists in the public interest. This past year the College had an extremely productive year as it prepared for anticipated future changes and moved forward in improving our regulatory processes in order to better serve the public.

Ms. Millicent Vorkapich-Hill, Podiatrist was elected President. Her term came to an end in October 2018, at which time Mr. Martin Hayles, Chiropodist, was elected President. Ms. Vorkapich-Hill was elected as Vice-President at the same time.

The College continued to work closely with Public Health Ontario to finalize the checklists in relation to infection control. This is an extremely important undertaking as the checklists will allow members to self-reflect and will be used by Public Health if they are called upon to review a member's practice. In tandem, the Standard of Practice on Infection, Prevention and Control was amended. We participated in an initial meeting with the Ministry of Consumer and Government Services and other health regulatory Colleges regarding their policy review of the accessible parking permits program. The College approved a guideline dealing with Extraosseous Subtalar Joint Implant procedure as well as the audited financial statements for 2017 and the budget for 2018. The College also importantly amended its General By-law No. 1 specifically dealing with the public register. It was circulated to members and other stakeholders and finally approved. The College also clarified the wording s. 44.02 of the General By-law No. 1 dealing with practice locations and the obligation to report to the College.

PRESIDENT & REGISTRAR'S Report (continued)

The College contracted with a provider to begin the work to transfer the College's database to an iMIS platform. This is a very important initiative as it will enhance the ability to report and collect statistical information. It is anticipated that finalization of the transfer will probably take about a year to complete. The College successfully ran its first approved course on Inhalation.

The College was asked to be the program client in order to help facilitate the Michener Institute of Education at UHN's accreditation of the chiropody program. The College is involved because there is no other chiropody program in Canada. The College continued its dialogue with the Ministry regarding scope of practice changes. The purpose of this request is to improve patient care and outcomes and to stop, or at least lessen, circular referrals back to doctors in relation to ordering lab tests as an example. Finally, the College moved suites in the same office building in November 2018.

A very sincere thank you goes out to our Council and Committee members for their ongoing commitment, dedication and hard work and to the Registrar and staff for their tireless efforts. It has been a busy, exciting and very productive year and we look forward to 2019.



EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

he Executive Committee (Committee) is a statutory committee that makes decisions between Council meetings. It has all the powers of the Council with respect to any matter that in the Committee's opinion requires immediate attention, other than the powers to make, amend or revoke a regulation or by-law.

The Committee had three face-to-face meetings this year and met on a regular basis by teleconference. The Committee reviewed the changes necessary to the College's General by-law, specifically Article 42, to ensure consistency with Bill 87 - Protecting Patients Act. The Executive recommended that the proposed changes be approved in principle and circulated for at least 60 days to members and other stakeholders for comments. The Executive also recommended that the section in the General By-law dealing with practice location be clarified and amended. Amendments were made and it was recommended that Council approve it in principle and circulated for at least 60 days to members and other stakeholders for comment. The Standard and Guidelines Committee continued to work with Public Health to put into place a checklist for Infection Control. It will be used as a self-assessment tool for practitioners and by Public Health if they are required to enter a member's office. The Executive continued to explore possible scope of practice changes with the Ministry. We prepared a MESPO document that was ready to be put forward to the Ministry. After Council approved the Guideline for Extraosseous Subtalar Joint Implant Procedure, amendments were requested and made and recommended to Council. The Executive committee recommended to Council that it authorize a review of the bylaw in relation to eligibility to be a member of Council and how we elect members which is planned to be finalized in 2019.

The Committee recommended to Council the approval of the proposed 2018 budget as well as the 2018 Audited Financial Statements.

QUALITY ASSURANCE COMMITTEE



he primary objective of the Quality Assurance Program is to provide members of the College of Chiropodists of Ontario with the opportunity to enhance their knowledge base and clinical skills so as to encourage excellence in the delivery of foot care to the public.

The following reflects the work of the committee during 2018.

CE Log Program

The Committee completed all outstanding matters relating to those members randomly selected to participate in the 2016-2017 continuing education program. This included a review of the members' CE submission and a decision as to whether or not each one met the College's CE requirements. Any deficiencies were noted to the member and corrective action was mandated. For example, those who did not fully meet the requirements were advised that they will need to go through the same process in the next cycle. The 2018-2019 cycle began in January 2018.

Declaration of Completion

Members of the College are required to execute a Declaration of Completion on the Member's Annual Renewal form which states that "I have reviewed my practice and completed the Quality Assurance Self-Assessment Tool. I have created a plan to address the continued professional developmental objectives I have identified in this Self-Assessment Tool. I understand that I must retain the completed Self-Assessment Tool and Continuing Education log in my files."

Practice Assessment Program

Random Practice Assessments

A roster of members from across the province was selected as practice assessors and completed training which allows them to act as practice assessors throughout the random practice assessment program. The random practice assessments continue on a 2-year cycle. When the assessors complete their reports, the QA committee reviews them and determines what, if any next steps are required. The QA Committee completed their review of the assessment reports that were conducted during this cycle and found that all members reviewed met the requirements of the assessment.

he Inquiries Complaints and Reports Committee ("ICRC") is responsible for the investigation of complaints, as well as the approval and disposition of Registrar's Investigations with respect to the conduct and competence of members. It is also responsible for inquiries into whether or not a member is incapacitated. As required by statute, every matter is considered by a panel of the Committee comprised of at least two professional member of the Committee and one member of the Committee appointed to the College by the Lieutenant Governor in Council. After the panel considers all of the Relevant information in a matter, it renders a decision.

If either party to a complaint is dissatisfied with the adequacy of the Committee's investigation or believes the decision in unreasonable, he or she can request a review by the Health Professions Appeal and Review Board (HPARB). The HPARB is an adjudicative tribunal under the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991 (RHPA). Through reviews, the HPARB monitors the activities of the ICRC to ensure it fulfills its duties in the public interest and as mandated by legislation.

The College received 24 new complaints during the year and conducted eight Registrar's investigations, for a total of 32. Of these 32 matters the Committee disposed of 15 within 2018, as well as carryovers from previous years. One matter was referred to the Discipline Committee.

For the complaints and registrar's investigations that were disposed of in 2018, the issues related to Standards of Practice, Billing, Record Keeping, Conduct and Advertising.

In every complaint/Registrar's investigation, there is more than one issue. As a result, the Panel investigates each issue separately. dispositions included: Take No Further Action and/or Offering Advice and/or giving an Oral Caution and/or requiring the Member to take a Specified Continuing Educational or Remedial Program (SCERP).

In 2018, there were zero decisions appealed to HPARB.

DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE

he Discipline Committee is a statutory committee under the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991. The Discipline Committee holds hearings into allegations of a member's professional misconduct or incompetence which has been referred to the Committee by the ICRC Committee. If a panel of the Discipline Committee finds a member has committed an act of professional misconduct it may make orders doing any or more of the following:

- Directing the Registrar to revoke or suspend a member's certificate of registration or to impose terms, conditions and limitations on the member's certificate of registration;
- Requiring the member to appear before the Committee to be reprimanded;
- Requiring the member to pay a fine not exceeding \$35,000.00 to the Minister of Finance; and/or
- Requiring a member to pay all or a portion of the College's costs related to the matter brought before the discipline committee.

In 2018, the ICRC made one referral to Discipline. Four discipline hearings also took place, the results of which are posted on the College's website at www.cocoo.on.ca/discipline-decision-summaries/.

REGISTRATION COMMITTEE

he Registration Committee is a statutory committee under the *Regulated Health Professions Act*, 1991 with the mandate to consider referrals from the Registrar relating to applications for a certificate of registration. After considering an application for registration the Committee may direct the Registrar to:

- Issue a certificate of registration
- Issue a certificate of registration if the applicant successfully completes examinations set or approved by the Committee.
- Issue a certificate of registration if the applicant successfully completes additional training specified by the Committee.
- Impose specified terms, conditions and limitations on a certificate of registration of the applicant and specify a limitation on the applicant's right to apply for an order removing or modifying any term, condition or limitation imposed on a member's certificate of registration as a result of a committee proceeding, and/or
- Refuse to issue a certificate of registration.

The Committee also considers members' applications for an order removing or modifying any term, condition or limitation imposed on a member's certificate of registration as a result of a Committee proceeding.







Chiropodists & Podiatrists by Age Group


